seek justice.

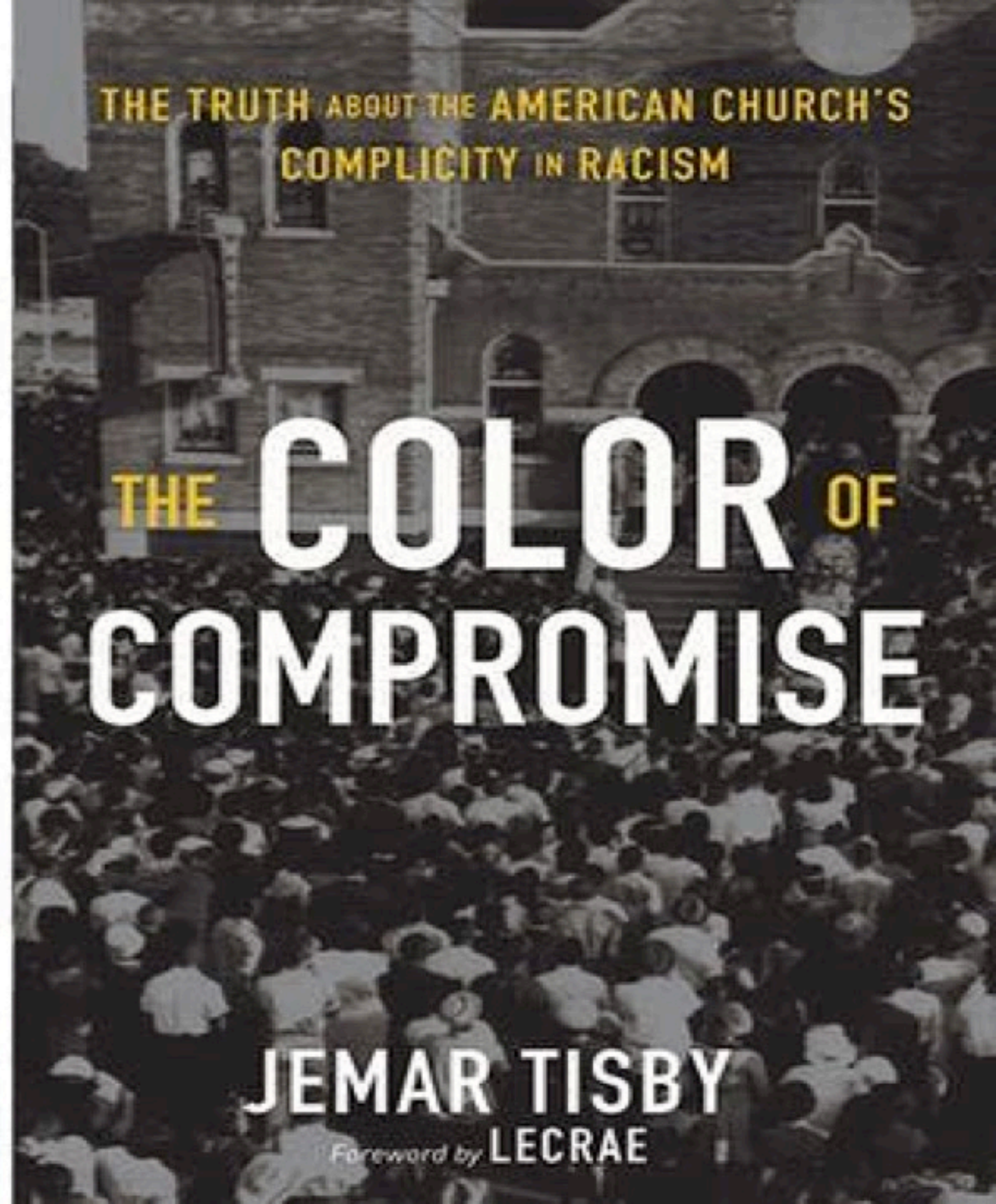
They do not promote the
